

## **Sustainable Use of Forest Space: Aligning with Forest Stewardship® FSC® and Sustainable Forestry Initiative® SFI® Standards**

The Campus Forest, managed by Canadore College, achieved both FSC and SFI certification in 2024, ensuring activities and management in the forest protect biodiversity, confirm sustainable harvesting, and safe-guard long-term ecosystem health.

The guidelines below are intended to direct users to ensure that activities fall within the parameters outlined within certification standards:

### **Key Guidelines:**

1. **Permission for Cutting, in-water work, or other activities causing alteration to the forest ecosystem:** Obtain written approval before any tree cutting or other similar work to ensure compliance with the forest management plan and certification requirement.
2. **Wear PPE:** Proper safety gear (hard hats, eye protection, gloves, boots) is mandatory for all personnel involved in forest operations. This is both a legal and certification requirement.
3. **Install Signage:** Place signs at forest entrances and key areas to inform workers and the public about activities, protected zones, and potential hazards.
4. **Protect the Site:** Limit activities and impacts to the smallest reasonable area and do not leave any garbage or other debris behind
5. **Document Activities:** Record details of forest activities (e.g., trees cut, wildlife protection measures) to maintain certification compliance.
  - **Sample Report:** On October 7, 2024, five mature trees were selectively harvested in Canadore College's northern forest to enhance regeneration and ecosystem health. All safety protocols were followed, signage posted, and necessary permissions obtained.
